"You could definitely tell in the timeout before that we were all kind of like, 'we're screwed, and we can't get it in," Ashley Cordt '18 said. "Sitting on the bench, I saw

their defense immediately figure out what play we were going to run and I was sitting on the bench thinking, 'oh no, this is not going to work.""

Sneakers squeaked against the polished hardwood floors as Zrust's teammates tried to set her up for a shot.

"I was in with Jordan by my side," Areefa **Seepersaud** '19 said. "One of us had to shoot a three, it was her or me, it didn't matter who. We just needed a scoring opportunity."

While Zrust's teammates blocked the opposing team, she attempted to shoot a deep three.

"They set a screen for me," Zrust said. "I was like, 'I don't know if I should take this or not.' The time was running out, and I was just like, 'okay, I can do it.' I just shot it, and I made it. Coach called a timeout, and I ran to my team. Everyone was hugging

me, and that feeling was "The time was just so amazing. We had so much more energy, like, 'oh my goodness, we are in this again, we can come back.' When the final buzzer went off and we went into overtime, we were like, 'okay we got this.""
