What made this year unique was the intense motivation and endurance shared by every member of the team.

"Our group in general has been a little bit more competitive this year, we all have this want to win," Blythe Rients said, an outside hitter on the team. Behind their series of victories lies not only a desire to win, though, but also an unwavering resilience, an ability to keep going, even in the face of harsh losses: Libero Sophia Rose said, "Coming from games that have been very much not in our favor, something we really focused on this year was never giving up, regardless of the outlook of the game."

Building off of their competitive spirit, another main focus of the season was the team's ability to work together.
